- About 190 students are enrolled in the elementary school from PK to 5th grades. Classes are taught by certified and experienced teachers, all of whom are committed to professional development for the best instruction of our students.
- At CPSA, we seek to address learning styles of all students through integrating technology, use of learning centers, leveled reading groups, and much more. Students requiring support or enrichment meet in small groups for targeted instruction within the classroom or in the form of pullout groups.
- Preschool provides a full day of activities that focus on developing students' educational, social and emotional strengths. Beginning in Kindergarten, arigorous academic curriculum in core and special subjects is at the heart of the program which is offered along with lots of extracurricular opportunities and resource supports.

Academic Offerings

- Curriculum is aligned to state and Common Core standards.
- Reading programs like Accelerated Reader, Book IT!, and Read to Succeed provide incentives to motivate students.
- Science and Social Studies are taught with a hands-on approach along with related field trips, guest presenters, and Junior Achievement sessions.
- Quran and Arabic classes ensure that the 30thJuz of the Quran is memorized in the elementary years with a tertiary understanding of vocabulary.
- Online Learning tools such as Khan Academy, Moby Max, and Discovery Learning are utilized in class
- Physical Education, Computers and Art are offered at all grade levels as part of a whole child approach to learning.

Extra-Curricular and After School Opportunities

Each year, elementary students compete in competitions where participation is optional, yet is highly anticipated by the students. The variety of competitions allows students of various strengths and talents to be recognized for their efforts.

Selected elementary students participate in inter-school competitions such as the **Math Bowl**, **Science Bowl** and **History Bowl**. At these events, students work collaboratively in teams with other schools and compete independently against their peers. CPSA students continue to place in top 3 individually and in teams for every academic bowl.
