CPSA is excited to announce that we will be offering online classes for Math, English, and Islamic Etiquette this summer. The classes are open to non CPSA students as well. The course offerings are as follows:

<u>General</u>: The classes will meet online via live interactive lectures along with assigned reading and homework. Math and English classes will be held four days a week for five weeks for a total of 20 hours of instruction over the course of the summer. Islamic Etiquette classes will be held three hours a week for five weeks for a total of 15 hours of instruction over the summer. These are non-credit classes. For students who maintain good attendance, participate, complete the assignments, and satisfy the expectations of the course, a certificate of completion will be provided by CPSA.

<u>Math</u>: The math classes will provide a thorough review of the most important topics in each subject area. They are perfect for students who plan to take these classes next year and would like to be well prepared by engaging the topics over the summer. They are also perfect for those who have already taken these classes over the past year and would like to strengthen their mastery of the subject in preparation for their next math class. The class will incorporate IXL for students to practice what they are learning in class. IXL performance will be used to provide feedback on student progress which will be communicated with parents. If you are not sure which class is best suited for your child, feel free to contact Dr. Mansuri for course selection guidance. Generally, students should only consider taking their next math class this summer if they made excellent progress and have a strong foundation in the class that they just completed.

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English: The Level 1 course is designed for middle school students. It will introduce intermediate writing skills with a focus on purpose, audience, graphic organizers, organizational patterns, and drafting. The course will support decoding new vocabulary, differentiating between formal and informal writing, and providing a foundation for the eight parts of speech while also learning how to implement reliable sources and avoid plagiarism to support English and Social Studies courses. The Level 2 course is designed for high school students. It will introduce planned writing through organization and drafting while implementing essay formats, sources, and purpose along with Grammar and vocabulary skills attainment. The course will support decoding new vocabulary, differentiating between formal and informal writing, identifying the various sentence structures and types, and AP ready writing for high school.

<u>Islamic Etiquette</u>: This class will be a selected reading of Imām al-Bukhārī's al-Adab al-Mufrad. The text is a compendium of hadiths covering a wide range of ethics and etiquettes necessary for any striving upright Muslim to learn and implement. The fact that Imam al- Bukhārī exerted such effort to collate hadiths on the subject and produce an entirely separate volume highlights the importance of the subject matter. The goal in this class will be to highlight Islamic civilizational values, which are essential and foundational moral standards upon which an Islamic society hinges and pivots. The class will proceed with an introduction to a particular civilizational value, followed by a reading of hadiths. Discussion will be an important part of the class and students will be encouraged to ask questions. The Level 1 course is designed for middle school students and the Level 2 course is designed for high school students.
